SCHOOL FEES FOR 2024 - COST OF SCHOOL TRIPS TO BE INCLUDED IN FEES

Management of CityKidz decided to conduct a survey to determine if parents would prefer the inclusion of the costs for the school trips for 2024 academic year. This would mean that parents would not need to find unbudgeted money during the school year to pay for school trips.

On Saturday the 29th of July 2023, the teacher/parents meeting took place where the majority of parents attended. Parents were asked to vote on their preference.

The two options that parents were given to vote on were:

1. School fees structure to remain the same (with the annual increase) whereby they would pay school fees each month and then during the year pay additional amounts for the school trips separately.

OR

2. School fees that would be paid each month would include the cost of the school trips allocated during the year.

The survey showed that 77% of parents who attended the teacher/parents meeting, 88% of those parents voted in favour of including the school trips for the 2024 academic year.

Based on the overwhelm vote in favour of the **inclusive fee structure**, the Board of Directors of CityKidz Pre & Primary School NPC have decided to implement the new school fee structure for 2024 Academic year. Please see the fee structure for 2024 below:

Australian Books for Children of Africa

Lauren Klevansky and Andrea Wainer popped into school and delivered 3 big boxes of reading books! We are thrilled to receive such amazing books.

Australian Books for Children of Africa (South Africa) is a registered non-profit charity dedicated to promoting literacy and a culture of reading. We distribute good quality second-hand books (fiction and nonfiction) to disadvantaged schools, homework centres and communities, who desperately need these resources in the classrooms and to build up libraries.

Australian Books for Children of Africa has been running for 20 years and has supplied over 300 000 books to nearly 300 schools and organisations in South Africa, Kenya, Uganda, Ghana, Nigeria, DR Congo, Tanzania, Zambia, Swaziland and Zimbabwe. The work is carried out by a dedicated team of volunteers in Australia and Africa.

OUR BOOKS

The books we distribute come from school libraries and public libraries in Australia, which are well funded. In the past, these libraries would pulp the old library books when restocking their shelves. These books are now collected by *Australian Books for Children of Africa* (in Australia) and shipped to Africa. Natural Science

From ox wagon to magnetic levitation type of developments in the Natural Science Department.

The only way one can describe the new attitude or progress in our Natural Science department is to compare it to progress made on land transport that saw a change from people using ox wagons to the latest speed trains using magnetic levitation (maglev) for speed and distance.

In 2022 we started participating in the Gauteng Province's Natural Science Olympiad, which was a huge success. One of our learners won in the cluster and district competitions which resulted in him being one of three delegates representing our district in the provincial finals in Kempton Park.

This year we have motivated more learners to take part in competitions. The top eleven learners in Grade 6 participated in the National Science Olympiad organised and managed by the National Research Foundation (NRF) in collaboration with the South African Agency for Science and Technology Advancement (SAASTA). Their paper was geared to children from the Grade 4-6 group.

The second group participating in this Olympiads were the top four Grade 7 learners. Their paper was for the Grade 7-9 group. This means they were competing nationally against learners in grade 8 and 9.

We are now anxiously waiting for the results. The participation of learners in these competitions shows that as a science department we are at a level that can confidently compete not only at a provincial level, but nationally as well. Competitions are not only about winning, but are most importantly about exposure to the latest developments in the field of science. The knowledge and experience gained in this respect is beyond words.

It is within the spirit of exposure and competitiveness that the much anticipated CityKidz Science Club (CSC) was established. The main objective of our Science Club is to encourage independent and self-directed curiosity in science amongst learners at a very young age. Nurturing the links between science and creativity is the foundation upon which the club will operate. Some of the activities that the science club would be involved in include scientific debates, making projects and a variety of internal and external competitions. *Written and compiled by: Mr R. <u>CityKidz Support/Intervention Programme:</u>

We are cognisant of the fact that COVID-19 has had a detrimental effect on learning and teaching. As a school we have taken the necessary steps to assist learners who need additional help or have barriers to learning. Please note, that if your child is placed in the support/intervention program, this does <u>NOT</u> mean that they will fail. They have been identified as a learner who needs support or intervention in particular learning area/s. Teaching children with learning barriers is difficult; it requires extra time, patience, and creativity. Both programs cannot function in isolation, without the support from parents. By educating yourself on your child's barriers and working with teachers to provide the best environment, you can foster a love of learning and help your child succeed.

There are two different programs: the **Morning Support** classes which happen before school from 7h15 to 7h45. We expect all learners who have been recommended to attend, arrive on time for their support classes in the mornings.

The other support program offered is an intensive, **Intervention Support** which we offer during school hours with a highly qualified and experienced teacher. The learner may be struggling with one or more types of learning barrier. Mrs Slabbert is dealing with the learner according to his/her individual differences to ensure an effective learning process. Mrs Slabbert goes above and beyond to work with these children. The school provides these services at no additional cost to the parents.

Communication:

1. WhatsApp: Please note that the WhatsApp groups are established for instant communication, we therefore plead with parents to always be attentive and check every bit of information and communication sent on their child/children's WhatsApp group.

2. Communication channels: We would also like to reiterate the channel of communication. A parent is well within their right to request a meeting with the SMT and/or the principal. However, a proper channel of communication must be followed.

Once again, I will invite external judges for the competition to ensure impartiality and fairness. The criteria on how The Pallet Perfect Challenge will be judged are indicated below. I have also included some photographs to inspire you in creating wonderful functional pallet structures.

There will be prize money for the winning teachers and a party for the winning classes!! I'm sure you will all be buzzing with great ideas on how you can enhance our environment. Game on, Make Magic happen !

1.	Are the structures functional, complement one another and show attention to detail?			
2.	Do the structures have the "wow factor" and add to the beautification of the environment?			
3.	Have pallets been used in a unique, creative manner and reflect that teacher and class "made magic happen"?			
4.	Is there evidence to show that children and parents were involved in the pallet process?			
5.	Does the project ensure long-term sustainability i.e. Will the structures be responsibly managed and maintained ?


