

Our little Totz completed their number 1 activity. The Totz teachers turned the boards over and our little one's happily enjoyed "free drawing".



It was the experience of a life-time as our learners sang all the way, some with mixed feelings, and some expressing their fears. A plethora of questions kept on coming as the journey continued.

Our learners learnt a great deal from the well informed and passionate tour guides who did not tire from the inquisitive questions.

There was a deafening silence as the tour truck tore along a bumpy road into the safari as we caught the sight of majestic lions. Our learners were captivated by the king of the jungle and the lionesses, cheetahs, wild dogs and giraffe.

Here are some gold nuggets that were gained.

Did you know that the darker the lion's mane, the stronger that lion is, and that lions see 8 times better that humans in the night?

Did you know that the difference between a white lion and an albino lion is that white lions have a shade of brown and have a black nose, while albino lions are snow white, with a pink nose?

Cheetahs have what is called a honeycomb bone structure. This means that they have bubbles in their bones, making them lighter. This helps them to run up to 120km/h faster than most animals!

The riveting moment was when we watched in awe as the lions ran up to the lion trainer for a hug. We learnt that he has been looking after the lions for 20 years. The lions love and trust him. The sight of the wild dogs and antelopes was a welcome sight, because these animals tend to shy away from tourists. Another fascinating moment was the sight of Zoe the Giraffe who just appeared after we had a long wait for her to appear. She was so friendly and tame. Our learners enjoyed petting and feeding her.

The day was a wonderful experience and our learners were all smiles, with bellies stuffed with boerewors rolls, ice cream, chicken, burgers and endless snacks. It was not easy to say our goodbyes as our learners left with awe-filled eyes!













We can recycle lots of things! Here are some examples:


- Plastic bottles and containers

### Bottle Top Wall Mural and Tyre Grade Challenge 2024

Great news ... it's a whole-school competition again!!! The Bottle Top Wall Mural and Tyre Planter Grade Challenge is aimed at taking something ordinary –tyres and bottle caps and re-purposing them to create colourful, functional wall hangings (bottle caps) and outdoor designer planters made from tyres. This time the competition will involve an entire grade. (Non-Homeroom teachers, Admin and Maintenance will be allocated to assist a grade.)

At CityKidz we want to encourage and showcase how recycling can transform our environment. All you need to do is create, within your grade, one awesome planter structure made from tyres and one wall mural made from bottle caps. Choose a theme relevant to our community or elaborate on our theme "Be kind". (The measurements for the wall mural/ hanging MUST be, nothing more and nothing less, than the stipulated requirement: 2m x 2m.)

Each grade will submit a group entry (two items). Therefore, the project will focus on teamwork, foster collaboration, and cohesion. Over the next couple of months, you need to encourage children to collect bottle caps! Encourage responsible sourcing, set up bottle cap collection points and organise washing of bottle caps. Start sourcing board, tyres, glue, paint, varnish, soil, plants, and other essentials, if needed.

Choose the desired location and space needed for your grade. Ensure the wall space has a suitable surface for a mural and properly primed for adhesion of the board. How you, as a grade, go about this is entirely up to your grade, but it is important to get your parents involved.

Remember, the tyre and wall mural will be showcased as one grade entry with two items per grade. It might seem easier this way, but the competition is going to be on another level. This year 2024 is an election year and casting a vote is very important, therefore we will also consider a public voting component, learner votes as well as inviting external judges for the competition to ensure impartiality and fairness. This adds to the excitement and allows for our CityKidz community to be involved and for children to cast valuable votes.

The criteria on how *The Bottle Top Wall Mural and Tyre Planter Grade Challenge* will be judged are indicated below. I have also included some photographs to inspire you in creating wonderful pieces. This challenge is a fantastic way to combine creativity, sustainability, and practicality.

There will be prize money for the winning teachers and a prize for the winning grade!! I'm sure you will all be brain-storming with great ideas and adding your own creative twist on how your grade can create a lasting Bottle Top



Wall Mural and Tyre Planter. Remember, the possibilities are endless when it comes to submitting a fantastic entry. With a little imagination and effort, you can transform our areas that add character and sustainability to our school. So, get creative, and give dull areas a new lease on life!
