
All parents are encouraged to attend.

Get set for a Growth Mindset!

Fixed vs Growth?

Do you thrive on challenge? Do you see failure as a springboard for growth and developing your abilities? If you can say yes to these questions, you have a growth mindset. Simply put, this mindset means that you believe in your ability to become better through hard work, and help from others.

What is a mindset? A mindset is the attitudes held by someone. A fixed mindset is the basic belief that you can't change your talents, traits, and abilities; in other words, you have certain abilities that you're born with, and that is that. A fixed mindset is an attempt to protect oneself from failure, however, students with the attitude of "I'm not good at this," rarely find success.

On the other hand, those who accomplish the most display determination and discipline. They don't give up easily, and they understand that setbacks don't mean that they are not good enough. This is a growth mindset. It has been found that those with a growth mindset are more motivated and successful.

How is a fixed mindset changed to a growth mindset?

Research shows that our brains are malleable, and that a fixed mindset can be changed to a growth mindset.

Start by identifying your current mindset. Be aware of the way you think, thoughts like "What if I fail?" or "If I don't try, nobody will see me fail," are signs of a fixed mindset. Once you are aware of your thinking you are able to make new choices. Try thinking new things to yourself like: "I'm not sure I can do it, but it will be worth it to try." This new way of thinking will help you move away from a fixed mindset.



Next, put yourself in situations that are challenging.

This will help you to practice your new attitude. School is a great place to practice a growth mindset. When developing your new mindset it is important to seek support and advice. It is equally important to keep focusing on yourself and how you can grow. Stop worrying if others are looking at your progress. Chances are, nobody is.

Sometimes, you may not succeed and that's ok. As you practice your new thinking and follow through with action, you will cultivate a growth mindset. Working to develop a growth mindset will ultimately help you succeed in any challenge that comes your way.

Collect children after school

PLEASE NOTE: There is NO SUPERVISION after school and parents are expected to be prompt in collecting children. Please arrange with transport drivers to collect your child on time or make plans to enrol your child at AfterCare. It is imperative that children are picked up straight after school! No loitering and hanging around will be accepted. Last term we had an unusually high number of parents and taxi drivers who were regularly late for pick up. Several children were collected around 16h00! Parents have been contacted on WhatsApp and issued letters. Late pick-up is unacceptable and will be recorded on the attendance records and a fine will be given. Children MUST go home straight after school. Please be aware that some drivers arrange with children to NOT go to the Pick up Zone and encourage them to wait for them on street corners away, to avoid having names recorded. Please have these chats to your transport drivers, if they are allowing your children to hang around on street corners. This is unsafe and discouraged.

We have an Aftercare service, make use of this service. It is well worth the cost to know that your child is in safe hands. Aftercare fees are paid in advance and we don't accept cash on the premises.
