

Grade 2

The importance of teaching Grade Two learners about the five major food groups.

Grade Two is a critical year for laying the foundation of future success, whether it is academic or personal. As the learners enter the second year of Foundation Phase, we teachers are tasked with instilling a love for learning, cultivating essential skills and nurturing a growth mind-set in our learners.

It is also of great importance to teach them about a balanced diet. We focus on the five major food groups:

Fruit and vegetables, Carbohydrates, Protein, Dairy and Fats.

Grade Two's are introduced to the concept of healthy food habits.

The five major food groups have the following benefits:

- provide a range of nutrients to the body.
- promote good health.
- help reduce the risk of illness.
- support growth development.
- foster good eating habits.

In the lessons, Grade Two's displayed lots of creativity by shaping different foods from the five major food groups using play dough.

They also identified the food groups from their packed lunch. Our learners thoroughly enjoyed the activities.



Leaders leading

The purpose of the club is to mentor the learners that stand out as leaders or already show leadership qualities. We are avoiding opening up the club to the entire grade as this would not allow us to have enough one-on-one time with the selected candidates. The purpose of this club is to give you guidance and support as you continue to embark on your leadership journey. The aim is to strengthen your leadership skills and to develop team building skills that will strengthen your performance as a group. The club is here to offer you invaluable mentorship that will guide you towards becoming a well-rounded leader. The learners not selected will have the opportunity to be added based on if/ when they show improvement in areas that they are currently lacking. At this moment selected learners have shown potential. We will choose leaders every 4 weeks, so each teacher gets a chance to facilitate a workshop. At the end of that cycle we will evaluate how the Leaders perform and apply the workshops in real life. Prefects will be chosen at a later stage.

Expectations of CK Leaders:

- Display good behaviour and good manners.
- Be responsible.
- Be capable of resolving conflict.
- Set a good example at all times.
- Display a positive attitude.
- Have a good work ethic.
- Wear the school uniform correctly and with pride.
- Be punctual and well-prepared for their responsibilities.
- Take the initiative when staff are not immediately visible.
- Act as additional pairs of eyes during break times and to report serious misbehaviour to staff members.
- **Carry out 'meet and greet' functions under staff guidance e.g. welcoming visitors to the school, assisting parents on Parent Information days etc.**



Grade 3

Our Differences are what make us special.

Life Skills in the first term of Grade 3 tackles topics that speak to the individual. We endeavour to teach our learners about themselves, their emotions, how to record the special events that happened in their lives, through timelines and overall, their uniqueness as an individual. They learn how to name and control their emotions, what makes them tick and what really puts them off, as well as how to verbalise what they are going through and how it makes them feel.

Through these topics our children learn about their different talents and that all of us have been uniquely crafted. Once our learners realise that being different is an asset, their self-confidence and self-love is boosted tremendously. Our favourite activity based on these concepts is making self-portraits. This year we did away with cutting and pasting and endeavoured to make little Picassos of our learners. What fun it was working with the different paints and paying extra attention to detail! 



The Earth takes exactly 365 days, five hours, 48 minutes and 45 seconds to circle the sun. The occasional Feb. 29 ensures we don't lose six hours every year.

2. Leap year babies are called "leapers" or "leaplings."

You'd get a special name, too, if you had to wait four years to celebrate your birthday.

3. Feb. 29 has traditionally been a day on which women were allowed to propose to men.

Sounds hopelessly outdated for the 21st century, but this is the way it has worked in many cultures for centuries!

4. Some cultures consider Feb. 29 an unlucky day.

In Italy, people say, "Anno bisesto, anno funesto," which translates as, "leap year, doom year." In some countries, like Greece, people warn against planning weddings during leap years.

5. Feb. 29 is not really a legal day.

Many companies don't recognize Leap Day as a "valid day." They make leapers choose Feb. 28 or March 1 as their birthday instead.

6. Lots of people work for free on Feb. 29.

Most employees who are paid fixed monthly incomes will work for free on Feb. 29 because their wages are likely not calculated to include the extra day.

7. There are two "Leap Year Capitals of the World."

If you want to celebrate this special day in a big way, head to Texas — or New Mexico. 
