
We are hoping for some beautiful sunshine, but in the event of poor weather lessons will continue as per Tuesday's timetable.

### Why study the Solar System?

The solar system consists of the Sun and everything that orbits, or travels around, the Sun. In other words every thing that is within the gravitational pull of the Sun. The Sun is the centre of the Solar system. This includes the eight planets and their moons, dwarf planets, and countless asteroids, comets, and other small, icy objects. However, even with all these things, most of the solar system is empty space. Space is almost a perfect vacuum, full of cosmic voids.

In Term 4 the Grade 4-7 learners are studying the solar system in Natural Sciences and Technology. The big questions that some of them have asked are: What can we learn from the solar system? Learning about the solar system may help us understand important issues such as how global warming will affect the Earth or how life originated on our planet. Why do we study what is happening in space rather than focusing on what is happening on planet Earth, as this is the only planthat has life? By studying the cosmos beyond our own planet, we can understand where we came from, where we are going, and how physics works under conditions which are impossible to recreate on Earth.

completing it before 2030. This shows the importance and relevance of the Solar System, and the Sun in particular. Currently, the topic our Grade 5 learners are talking about is the fact that in 2006 China secretly started their project of creating a "Sun" and succeeded within a few years. This sounds unbelievable and has created an ongoing debate amongst learners in other Grades and one is often stopped in the corridors to corroborate or deny it. This is encouraging as it pushes learners interest in Astrophysics.

The Sun and the Moon are amongst the topics covered by Grade 5s this term.

Mars' surface: The fact that some people with unbelievable wealth like (Pretoria born) Elon Musk want to colonise planet Mars and have started with that project, is a fascinating scientific fact. There is already progress in this regard as he has already successfully launched SpaceX (his space

project). He aims to achieve his dream by the year 2050. NASA has four robots on Mars helping gather information that we can use for our scientific experiments. 
Uniform items that have been misplaced are to be replaced promptly to avoid the untidy appearance of learners.
