Eid al-Adha

Eid al-Adha is an Islamic festival to commemorate the willingness of Ibrahim (also known as Abraham) to follow Allah's (God's) command to sacrifice his son Ishmael. Muslims around the world observe this event. In some traditionally Muslim countries, families or groups of families may purchase an animal known as *udhiya*, usually a goat or sheep, to sacrifice, but this is not common or legal in many other countries. In these countries, groups of people may purchase a whole carcass from a butcher or slaughterhouse and divide it amongst themselves or just buy generous portions of meat for a communal meal on Eid-al-Adha. People also give money to enable poorer members of their local community and around the world to eat a meat-based meal.

In the period around Eid al-Adha, many Muslims travel to Mecca and the surrounding area in Saudi Arabia to perform the Hajj pilgrimage. Package holidays are organized from many countries. Muslims may plan and save for many years to enable them to take part in this event, which is one of the five pillars of Islam.

We wish all our Muslim staff, friends and family a blessed Eid al Adha. Please note: Ms Abed; Mrs Amod; Mr Hoosein; Mrs Abdulla; Ms Patel and Mrs Fortune will be absent from school on the 01st September. We have made arrangements for substitute teachers .



On Eid-ul-Adha, wishing that your sacrifices are appreciated and your prayers are answered by the almighty.

Maths Challenge for the week

Joseph's flock has 55 per cent more sheep than goats. What is the ratio of goats to sheep in the flock?

The mean of a sequence of 64 numbers is 64. The mean of the first 36 numbers is 36. What is the mean of the last 28 numbers?

The sum of all 64 numbers is $64 \times 64 = 64^2$. The sum of the first 36 numbers is $36 \times 36 = 36^2$. So the sum of the remaining 28 numbers is $64^2 - 36^2 = (64+36)(64-36) = 2800$. Therefore the mean of these 28 numbers is 100.
