The CityKidz Spelling Bee has become a cherished tradition. Today, parents joined the captivated audience of classmates and staff, watching the sheer brilliance and nerve-wracking tension of word warriors facing off against each other. The atmosphere was electric with anticipation as contestants lined up before a panel of judges and spelt a given word.

For the past weeks, fifty-five learners, from Grade 1 to Grade 7, encouraged by parents and teachers, have been immersed in dictionaries and word lists. These learners have not merely memorised words; they have practised to understand the

meaning of words, language patterns, use logic and learned to be poised under pressure. But Spelling Bees are like choppy seas filled with hungry sharks. A single error means elimination, adding to the high stakes and intense pressure.

The thrill of the Spelling Bee competition lies in its unpredictability. The duo's message of connections was made even more memorable when they all joined in by connecting the red string.

The energy of Abdul Manack a former South African first-class cricketer known for his awe-inspiring cricket moves also engaged with the children and gave words of encouragement. Abdul reinforced within our learners the value of being kind and the connection we create with others.

After the special reading they went to the CityTotz Centre. The buzz grew louder when Ma'am Maria and Ma'am Fatima found the yellow plastic cricket bat for Abdul Manack to sign. All were mesmerised as the famous cricketer signed and wrote a special message on the bat.

By the end of the day our children were not just trilling with excitement; they buzzed with inspiration for reading and thoughts of spreading kindness. The story ignited a love for reading, has shown our children that anything is possible and how important it is to show care and consideration for others.

It was a day that will undoubtedly have a lasting effect on our children. Important lessons were learnt. Children were reminded of the importance of kindness. Frayda reminded Grade 3 learners to appreciate special people in their lives, parents, teachers, siblings and family members. Frayda also challenged Grade 3 learners to be Smile Ambassadors of the school. Now, the 3rd graders are on an important mission, to spread the happy and infectious emotion....a SMILE!

Our Grade 7s Technology curriculum covers an area where they learn about structures. Learners were tasked with constructing a unique model of a cellphone tower prototype. The tower is designed to help us stay connected, even during load shedding. As per usual our Grade 7s didn't disappoint, they submitted stunning work; even going so far as to build structures that mimicked life-sized models and using recycled materials. 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Accidents, whether on the playground, in the classroom, the toilets or even in the staffroom, require prompt and effective first aid. No staff member wants to feel unprepared for the shout that summons them to a sprained ankle, a nosebleed or bumped head.

CityKidz strives to create a safer environment for learners and staff. This week, fifteen staff members attended a two-day first aid training course facilitated by MediResponse.

On Day One, the training instructors, Richard Sithole and Aiden Mosselman, covered first aid theory. Many of us expected this to be dry as dust but their engaging delivery and mix of interactive learning methods made the day interesting and thought-provoking. Myths were dispelled as we learned the Heimlich Manoeuvre for choking, to apply cool running water for superficial burns and valuable nuggets such as no toothpaste or green soap on burns, no paper plugs for nosebleeds. Day Two had the participants applying the theory and practising the core components of First Aid Training. Highlights were:

- Bleeding Control: How to apply pressure and use bandages.
- Wound Care: cleaning, dressing and care of wounds.
- Fracture Management: Applying splints to immobilize broken bones.

CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation): chest compressions and rescue breaths to maintain circulation and oxygen flow to the brain. CPR was by far the favourite and the most strenuous. One hundred chest compressions had everyone puffing as we resuscitated the dolls. Every participant gave it their all especially with removing objects from the mouths of the baby dolls and then using two fingers or thumbs to restart their hearts.

The facilitators gave us food for thought when they asked: What role does first aid play in the workplace for you?

Apart from the obvious answers, we also discussed the empowerment we all felt, not feeling so helpless should an emergency arise. CityKidz is now a prepared workplace with a squad of qualified first aiders who can supervise learners on outings or trips with confidence.

By the end of the training, we had not only gained a first aid certificate but also invaluable skills that have transformed us from ordinary individuals into lifesavers. We are now equipped for emergencies, whether it is a fainting teacher, a squiffyeyed learner reeling from a thud on the head, a stray knee connecting with sharp edges or a teeny tiny paper cut, all of

which makes us first-aiders reach for our skills and the first-aid box.













Grade RR – Grade 1 = 67 tins Grade 2 – Grade 3 = 67 tins


Grade 4 – Grade 5 = 67 tins Grade 6 - Grade 7 = 67

So each phase only needs to collect 67 tins! Let's reach our target! (More tins are always welcome. Let's take up the challenge!)





### Bottle Top Wall Mural and Tyre Grade Challenge 2024

Great news ... it's a whole-school competition again!!! The Bottle Top Wall Mural and Tyre Planter Grade Challenge is aimed at taking something ordinary –tyres and bottle caps and re-purposing them to create colourful, functional wall hangings (bottle caps) and outdoor designer planters made from tyres. This time the competition will involve an entire grade. (Non-Homeroom teachers, Admin and Maintenance will be allocated to assist a grade.)

At CityKidz we want to encourage and showcase how recycling can transform our environment. All you need to do is create, within your grade, one awesome planter structure made from tyres and one wall mural made from bottle caps. Choose a theme relevant to our community or elaborate on our theme "Be Kind". (The measurements for the wall mural/ hanging MUST be no more or no less than the stipulated requirement: 2m x 2m.)

Each grade will submit a group entry (two items). Therefore, the project will focus on teamwork, foster collaboration, and cohesion. Over the next couple of months, you need to encourage children to collect bottle caps! Encourage responsible sourcing, set up bottle cap collection points and organise washing of bottle caps. Start sourcing board, tyres, glue, paint, varnish, soil, plants, and other essentials, if needed.

Choose the desired location and space needed for your grade. Ensure the wall space has a suitable surface for a mural and properly primed for adhesion of the board. How you, as a grade, go about this is entirely up to your grade, but it is important to get your parents involved.

Remember, the tyre and wall mural will be showcased as one grade entry with two items per grade. It might seem easier this way, but the competition is going to be on another level. This year 2024 is an election year and casting a vote is very important, therefore we will also consider a public voting component, learner votes as well as inviting external judges for the competition to ensure impartiality and fairness. This adds to the excitement and allows for our CityKidz community to be involved and for children to cast valuable votes.

The criteria on how *The Bottle Top Wall Mural and Tyre Planter Grade Challenge* will be judged are indicated below. I have also included some photographs to inspire you in creating wonderful pieces. This challenge is a fantastic way to combine creativity, sustainability, and practicality.

There will be prize money for the winning teachers and a prize for the winning grade!! I'm sure you will all be brainstorming with great ideas and adding your own creative twist on how your grade can create a lasting *Bottle Top Wall Mural and Tyre Planter*. Remember, the possibilities are endless when it comes to submitting a fantastic entry. With a little imagination and effort, you can transform our areas that add character and sustainability to our school. So, get creative, and give dull areas a new lease on life!
